From the Roxbury green, go north on Route 67 and turn right onto Route 199. The parking lot is ahead 0.75 miles on the right. A second entrance is through the Moosehorn Access on Moosehorn Road, about 0.7 miles miles on the right after turning off Davenport Road.

138 Acres

The preserves have two long loops for hikers. The Blue Loop begins at the white barns off Route 199 and includes steep climbs, rolling terrain and hemlock forest. The Red Loop begins off Moosehorn Road, skirts the bank of Moosehorn Brook and includes steep climbs over ridges and glacial boulders. Both trails pass by an old sawmill site and Caroline Glen, where the brook cascades through a rocky gorge rimmed by tall hemlocks.

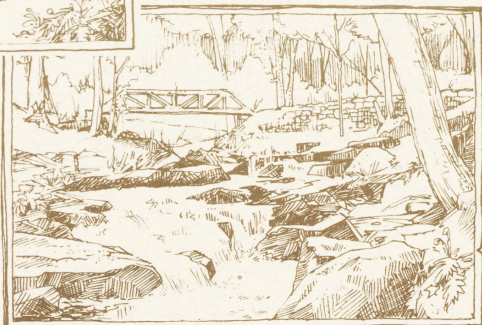
Blue Loop = 2.6 miles
